

Drive the Health and Growth of Specialty Palliative Care

In 2024, CAPC launched its first annual Palliative Pulse survey to gain a real-time understanding of the field's well-being. Palliative care program leaders and team members told us the growth opportunities and challenges they're focused on, how their programs are perceived inside of their organizations, and about the health and well-being of their teams. CAPC is using this information to inform the development of tools, resources, and data that will support the success of specialty palliative care teams across the country.



759 Palliative Pulse Survey Responses

Captured 759 responses to CAPC's inaugural survey to support the sustainability and growth of the palliative care field.



4,400 Virtual Event Attendees

More than 4,400 professionals attended 195 virtual events.





Clinicians and administrators accessed more than 142,000 downloadable tools on capc.org.






Released 2024 Serious Illness Scorecard

Catalyze Care Quality Improvement Beyond Specialty Palliative Care

While all people with serious illness should have access to palliative care specialists, every clinician they encounter should be equipped with a core set of palliative care skills to ensure high-quality, person-centered care. That's why CAPC is leading the way to train health professionals from all specialties, disciplines, and care settings—and partnering with disease-specific organizations to broaden our reach. Since launching our clinical training curriculum in 2015, more than 150,000 health care professionals have completed 1.35 million CAPC courses. In 2024 alone, clinicians across the U.S. completed 180,000 courses to strengthen their care of patients with serious illness.




Sold Out 12 New Virtual Workshops

Trained 169 clinicians on managing pain at the intersection of serious illness, chronic pain, and substance use disorder.




6,200 Clinical Training Assignments



CAPC is committed to addressing gaps in access to care—and quality of care. Our health equity roadmap includes tools and training for health equity champions, convening opportunities for peer-to-peer problem-solving, clinical training for health professionals, and extensive speaking and publication on strategies to address disparities among patients with serious illness.
